CSS ANIMATIONS

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The final page for your site is going to be a gallery featuring different responsive CSS animations. You will be provided with an HTML template for this page, as well as, an additional CSS file that handles the animations on this page.

The *animation.zip* file that can be downloaded from this week's work folder contains the template files you need.

Your mission if you choose to accept* it, is to create an animation.html page utilizing the contents from the downloaded animation template.

THIS IS A TEST. Plain and simple. There is nothing in the creation of this last page that we have not done multiple times during this course. I suggest looking over the previous handouts for some refreshers. You may also refer to your fellow students, books, websites, and even google, however you are **NOT** allowed to ask me *how to do something* unless it is something that we have not covered in this class.

This page will be submitted with your finished site on the final day of class. Which means you have until then to complete it...**PERFECTLY**. It will be graded independently from the rest of your final site and given the fine-tooth comb treatment. This is to say that every detail will be scrutinized. **EVERY** line of code will be looked over.

PROJECT GOALS

This page must match in design and style with all of the other pages of your final site.

You will need to have this page successfully linked to all of your other pages. *Meaning that the links on this page work, as well as, all other pages linked to this page are working.* You will need to create 6 image files for use in the gallery (since 3 of these links are the same as the index page you are allowed to reuse the images from your index page and just create 3 new ones). The images need to be set to 350 x 350 pixels.

Keep the title <h3> tags of the animations (i.e. "Fade In Text") unchanged.

The gallery links should take the user to your:

- Color Mini Site**
- Web Banners PDF**
- 1 Type Exercise**
- About Page
- Resources Page
- Home Page

TIPS, HINTS, AND THINGS TO WATCH OUT FOR

- Make sure your animation.html page is in your root folder
- Make sure the animation.css file is in your css folder
- Using a copy of an existing page and changing the inner portion with the content from the template will make sure the head, header, and footer are correct. (hint: the main content of the template falls between the <!-- start motion content --> **AND** <!-- end motion content --> tags).
- Make sure the animation page is connected to the animations.css file in the head, and that the link is last (so place it under the style.css link).
- The links are the text inside the animation and not the images themselves. If you set the image as the link the links won't work.
- You only need to replace the `src="https://placeholder.it/350x350"` with the image source for the images you have created.
- **Always add a `target="_blank"` to links that go to pages that do not have your site's navigation. This way you don't lose a visitor (because no one enjoys hitting the back button in a browser multiple times).
- Don't forget to set the <title> for the page. Not doing so shows a lack of attention to detail, which is the opposite of good web design.
